Are there any known FIP (feline infectious peritonitis) or FIV (feline immuno virus) cases in your neighborhood or household?		

We strongly recommend a 1-year rabies vaccine for all of our feline patients due to the risk of vaccine induced fibrosarcoma. A 3-year rabies vaccine is available. Please ask the doctor to determine which vaccine is right for your pet.
